



Tokyo Airport Transfers and Transport Information

Navigation options:

- Google Maps (free) - provides detailed public transport options and assists ease of subway navigation (details the train lines, stops and transfers)
- Optional - Download Japan Travel (Navitime) app (subscription not required for basic functions)- [Japan Travel by NAVITIME\[iPhone/Android\]](#). Integrates online purchases - eg. Keisei Skyliner (Narita airport, less helpful for navigating subway stops).

Payments on subways:



Suica card (Welcome Suica is tourist version) - buy physical card at airport, or download Welcome Suica app on phone to link digital card to wallet

- Easy to tap and pay for all metro subways - Tokyo Metro, JR East, Toei Subway

Note: Suica can be used instead of JR Pass for Tokyo metro travel. JR pass only works on selected city subway lines.

Airport transfers:

Tokyo has two major international airports

- Haneda - 20 km from Akasaka
- Narita - 75km from Akasaka

The main options are train, transfer buses or taxi/uber.

From Narita airport:

Check Google Maps route to your destination for best options at the time. Consider public transport:

- Train: Keisei Skyliner [Skyliner | KEISEI Electric Railway](#)
 - From Narita to Tokyo CBD, trains depart regularly reserved seat
 - Reserve online here [Skyliner e-ticket](#) or purchase at airport (Skyliner Ticket Counter/Machine)
 - Transfer at Nippori or Ueno station to Akasaka subway trains or taxi/rideshare
- Airport limousine bus - [Airport Limousine Bus](#)
 - Departs approx every 1-2 hours, between approx 8:30 am - 7pm

 - Multiple stops in Akasaka

From Haneda airport

Check Google Maps route to your destination for best options at the time. Consider public transport:

- Train - two key lines to Tokyo city, transfer to Akasaka lines
 - Tokyo Monorail
 - Keikyu airport line
